_____ "Men at some time are masters of their fates: The fault, dear Brutus, is not in our stars, but in ourselves, that we are underlings". (Act I, Scene II)

_____ "Not that I loved Caesar less, but that I loved Rome more". (Act III, Scene II)

_____ "Beware the ides of March". (Act I, Scene II)

_____ "This was the noblest Roman of them all". (Act V, Scene V).

_____ "When that the poor have cried, Caesar hath wept: Ambition should be made of sterner stuff". (Act III, Scene II)

_____ "Yond Cassius has a lean and hungry look; He thinks too much: such men are dangerous." (Act I, Scene II)

_____ "For Brutus is an honourable man; So are they all, all honourable men". (Act III, Scene II)

_____ "As he was valiant, I honour him; but, as he was ambitious, I slew him." (Act III, Scene II)

_____ "Cowards die many times before their deaths; The valiant never taste of death but once. Of all the wonders that I yet have heard, it seems to me most strange that men should fear; Seeing that death, a necessary end, will come when it will come." (Act II, Scene II).
